
orward with confidence.

I tried to use an overseas scholarship and finally participated in UGP after the time when I couldn't use it because of Corona. I wondered Finland as the first country on my first trip to Europe. I was a little worried about meeting people, who were at the same school but would never have encountered them, for two weeks of the program and staying together in a completely new environment, but I left Korea with excitement. In fact, my close friends participated in the program together, so I thought it was okay not to get close to new people. Indeed, I got along pretty well with other people and became quite close. However, I was a little distracted without feeling that I had arrived in a new country. The immigration process took a lot longer than I thought, and I had a friend waiting for me at the airport for three hours, so I only thought I should get out of it quickly. Most of the time, I thought it was too late on my way to the hotel by taxi with my friend from the airport. Still, what I felt while taking a taxi was that it was a country where communication was good in English, so I had to somehow speak with my short English skills. That alone made me feel like I was abroad enough. The time has finally come for me to be in the minority position. I didn't feel anything special because I just looked at the road while riding a taxi, but English and Finnish signs, low buildings, and piles of snow collected in one place were indicating Finland. When I arrived at the hotel, got the key, and entered the room, there is not a roommate, so I took a shower and went out for dinner. It turns out that Minsu, my roommate, was a friend who is fellow colleague and was undergoing immigration right in front of me. Minsu took the subway and I took a taxi and arrived earlier.

I participated in the program with Joochan and Changjun, and I found out that Minjeong, who I knew before, also participated. Changjun, who arrived before me, became close to Yejin and Hanjoo, who are other fellow colleague, and naturally, six colleagues went out to have dinner together. The first dinner I had was reindeer steak across from Helsinki Cathedral.



To be exact, I chose it as a course, and among them, reindeer steak came out. The name of the store is 'Restaurant Savotta'. I chose everything from starter to wine because I want to eat nicely when choosing course. I also ordered bear meat because I was curious, and it came out like jangjorim, but the strong bear scent was enough to get tired of eating it, but the reindeer steak was quite delicious. The most delicious food I had in Finland was this reindeer steak. The taste was different from pork and beef to me, and the mashed potato served with it was delicious with plenty of butter. Before going to dinner and on the way back to the hotel after dinner, I took the subway comfortably, and the street felt like a mixture of medieval and modern times, so I felt like I really came to Europe. It was a fairly calm and easy place to use public transportation. The transportation card we used was pretty good. To talk more about public transportation, Finland was a place where transportation was quite convenient and a trust-based society. The transportation cards I received were two 1-week passes, and once the pass was opened, there was no need to show my pass whenever I used any transportation. Ordinary citizens seemed to be able to use these passes. As a result, I saw more than half of people not showing traffic passes, paying tickets, and paying money at subways, buses, and trams. We used it fairly but I thought no one would know if someone rode it without using these tickets. In fact, I have never seen anyone look strange or check if there are actually valid tickets even if they just pass the subway ticket gate or get on the bus without doing anything. The train to the airport was completely unavailable with the transportation card we received, so we should have bought a extra ticket, but we couldn't see any staff or machines checking even the tickets. When I saw it, I thought it was a very trust-based society.

While doing UGP, I took several classes and presented a project, but I want to highlight the outside of the class more than the class. The theme of class was AI, and it was interesting because I did not take it well in my major, chemistry, but it was not easy. Since UGP was a free atmosphere I was much more impressed by the aspects outside

the class. Since UGP basically took classes, it was difficult to go out together after class at 4 p.m. if you don't come forward and talk to others. Fortunately, I had friends I knew before and luckily I had a group to play with a day before the program's start date, but I thought that two weeks in Finland could be just a class and pass by for those who participated in UGP alone, especially those who didn't like to talk to others first. So, when the UGP is held later, I hope that each participant will have a chance to talk about themselves and get close to each other within three days of the start of the program. Of course, I think it would be good to encourage participants to make such time on their own even if they don't set a time so forcibly. In fact, that was the case this time, UGP supporters suggested having a proper self-introduction time in the social room to get closer together. Thanks to that time, I got to know people who had passed by and I felt an atmosphere that became more comfortable to talk to other people. However, it was a little late for the first Friday, and it was a bit disappointing because it was the day before teacher Shim, who played the role of guidance, left. Still, such a time was very fun and enjoyable.

I went to the National Museum and then to Nuuksio National Park. The National Museum was conducted as a guided tour, but it was also difficult to understand because it was conducted in English, and it was not explaining the entire museum, so there was not enough time to look around. That part was a bit disappointing. Nuuksio Park was also a guided tour, but it was much more relaxed. I liked to take pictures of the scenery and wanted to take pictures of the scenery without people if possible, so I followed the group slowly at the end of the line, and the guide who manages the back waited for it and sometimes kindly talked to me and added explanations. UGP conducts many classes on various topics including Ai and Big Data and group project for two weeks at Aalto University. There are many indoor and outdoor activities and Finnish culture & language classes where we can find out various aspects of Finland. There were many impressive things while taking these various classes.

First of all, there was a team project to think about and present how to solve one of UNESCO's Sustainable Development Goals. The ideation process was impressive. No matter how foolish and unrealistic a story was, I felt that it was very important to say it out loud first. To this end, the class created an environment where we can pour out everything that comes to our mind using various assistive tools such as post-its, time limits, and special or extreme situations. I used to specify my ideas in my head for a long time and give an opinion only when it was convincing enough, because I was worried that the opinion would be easily refuted or that there would be any errors. However, when I talked about my opinion during this brainstorming process, I felt that it could be an opportunity for others to think from a new perspective, even if it was not the answer. The team members all accepted each other's opinions positively and made much greater synergy by reinforcing the other's opinions. So I realized that I had been too negative and afraid to express my thoughts. This experience will allow myself to communicate with my team members more comfortably.

I learned more about Finland by Some lessons and activities include Finnish language and culture classes, Finnish dinners, The national museum of Finland, and Nuuksio trip. Especially, I got to know Finland better by hearing about Finland's historical background at the national museum. After the class, I used to visit various places in Helsinki, such as suomenlinna, which was used as a fortress. It helped me understand what these places would have looked like in the past. Finnish language and culture classes took place on the second day. We study how to say basic conversation like hello, thank you, and number. It was very helpful for me to live

in Finland for two weeks by learning Finnish expressions that I use a lot on a daily basis. In Finnish culture classes, I learned that Finns are basically independent and shy, so I was careful to talk to Finns. But when I asked them politely, there were many Finns who did their best to inform me.

In addition, among various special lectures, classes on imposter syndrome was also impressive. I didn't know there would be a psychology class in this program, but it was a very interesting class. Imposter syndrome is a phenomenon that attributes my success to luck and believes that my skills are not that great. Others think that I have a high level of skills because they see my achievement, but I am also worried that I will be found out my low level because I am lucky to have achieved it and I don't think I can succeed that much again with my skills. There was a time when I thought I had low self-esteem and didn't trust myself well, but it was interesting to be able to define such a figure through the word 'imposter syndrome'. In addition, other students also have that aspect, and they shared the experience of overcoming it. During this class, I thought I could overcome the imposter syndrome.

What was impressive about AI & Big data was the AI art generator and chatGPT covered in the AI class. AI art generator creates a picture that fits the sentence by entering several variables, including the sentence I want, the element I want to enter, and the element I don't want to enter. A task was given to make a picture expressing the meeting between Finland and Korea. It is hare process that AI recreating the image I imagined into a picture by expressing it in text. It was more difficult than I thought. ChatGPT is an Open AI chatbot that is much more intelligent than Simsimi in Korea or Siri in iPhone. Interestingly, chatGPT can write essays and make some codes. We also asked chatGPT about where to go to play when there is no place to go in Helsinki anymore, and what are the problems of the current city to create a sustainable city. ChatGPT gave high-quality answers for both of question. On the recommendation of ChatGPT, we visited to the trampoline park and had fun.

We used to learn various fields at university from 9 to 4, but we were not only at aalto University all day. After the class, we traveled around Helsinki's various tourist attractions and restaurants. We also went to pubs with UGP team members. In fact, I haven't enjoyed traveling so far, and I like to spend time with a few close friends. In addition, after entering university in 2020, I have not been able to experience club activities and MT due to the influence of COVID-19. There was also a view that it's too bad for graduating without having the precious experiences I could have in college, but I thought I wasn't that upset because I wasn't such an extrovert. 

The reason why I first applied for this program was just to meet many people and learn about the culture of other countries. I applied without hesitation for this experience to be of help to me. Not only it was thankful to pass these programs, but also I got more intense impressions and feelings than I thought. Furthermore it was a great opportunity to learn about Al and big data while learning a lot of new friends. I will explain how it was good to me and some feelings as my opinions.



On the class of data, we learned more detail about digital twins and strategic management of technological innovations. Business is still worked with physical skills, so we need to combine digital and physical method. They interact with data, control, etc. From sensor technology and control systems. In two classes of Finnish culture and the language, we have learned about how Finnish people lives and how they communicate, and where they live. From the first class about the lecture, professor told how to speak the Finnish words, for examples, there are two same alphabets coming right next to the first words such as number 5 as 'viisi'. It has two linked words of 'i'. It was surprised to me because I had never heard about it and little bit difficult to pronounce Finnish words. Moreover, we could receive information about the history about Finland. They are conquered by the Swedish Emperor for a long time ago, and they also conquered by Russia. From this class, even though it is not my major or interesting field to me, but I could experience about the big data, how they processed, and lastly when I realized these kinds of data processing are applied in my real life, I was really surprised to the advanced technologies. It was a great experience to me.



Many students mentioned at the feedback that they could feel funny when we went to the Nuuksio National Park at Espoo. I also think agree to these friends. The activity we had contained lunch and walk around the national park. Whole trees and the whole land are covered with snow that I could felt I actually went to the Northern Europe. And the roasted salmon and potatoes made from wildfire tasted great to me. I ate a lot of menus of salmon, but it was better than before. I think that this activity program is great to us because we could learn and do how the Finnish people live. It was impressive moment to me, too.


I am very thankful which gave me this chance to learn a lot. And I really, really want to recommend that please apply to these programs.



Three experiences

This ugp activity gave me various experiences in many aspects, including European (Finland) cultural experience, various activities at Alto University, and bonding experience among many senior and junior colleagues.

The UGP program is organized as a program that allows you to travel freely from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. within Alto University after that, and to experience Finnish culture for a longer time on weekends.

- I learned a lot about Finland through this opportunity. This is my second trip to Europe, and through my first trip to Europe, European countries arrived in Finland with the experience of poor security. That's why I went around the street more carefully, keeping things and looking around. However, after living in Finland for two weeks, I broke the idea that all European countries have bad security. The security in Finland was better than I thought, and I could enjoy the trip comfortably.
- Also, Finnish language and English coexist in Finland, but I didn't feel much pride in my own language like France. The Finnish people felt like Japanese when they answered comfortably in English.

But there were also some inconveniences in Finland.

Also, it was burdensome to eat at restaurants because prices in Finland were 1.5 times higher than those in Korea. One of the ways that the maintenance crew came up with was to buy food at the mart and eat it at the accommodation. Unlike restaurants, you could buy simple foods at a cheap price at the mart. It was even less seasoned than a restaurant, so I think it tasted good to Koreans. Fortunately, I have been exposed to Finnish traditional foods such as reindeer meat and cheese, so I ate it cheaply without much dissatisfaction with buying food at the mart.

My activities at Alto University were also very helpful to me. My most memorable activity was the Nuxio Field Trip. It was because it was the first time I rented a bus and visited a natural park to learn about traditional culture and tour.

Also, it was interesting to learn Finlandung language at school. I didn't really have much interest in Finnish language. However, after learning it, I became more interested in greeting the locals in Finnish, and I was able to concentrate more on the second class.

Finally, there are relationships between people.






learned about the different tools and technologies used in big data management, including Hadoop, Spark, and NoSQL databases.



In the afternoon, I attended a class on the basics of big data analysis, taught by Professor Hong-Linh Truong. It was a challenging class, but I learned a lot of useful


information that I can apply to future projects. The class on Inposter Syndrome also gave me an opportunity to reflect on my own experiences and assess if I was experiencing any mental health issues.






Thanks to new experiences and studies, I can take many memories and knowledges during this program. I was surprised because the reason I can do like this is I am a UNISTAR

The second week of the program went on in a similar way. Nuuksio National Park, which was held on Monday afternoon, was a place that matched the representative image of Northern Europe. We were able to hear explanations about Finland's natural environment and culture while



hiking for about an hour, and I remember it was a time that many students were satisfied with.



On the 24th and 25th, similar to the first week, we took a class to help figuring out problems and solutions based on SDG issues for the final presentation. In particular, the lecture on presentation skill was very helpful because it could be applied not only to

this program, but also to other situations. On Thursday, the day before the final presentation, our team members gathered at the hotel to make presentation materials. We went through the process of cooperating with each other by choosing parts to take charge of, making presentation

materials and scripts, and we toured downtown Helsinki together in the remaining time.

On the last day of the program, the official schedule was completed with the final presentation. Studying through many SDG topics of other teams, it was useful to have wider perspective about global



issues, not just superficially, but with deep understanding. After having lunch together, we had individual tour for the last schedule. Finnish food was generally salty but to my taste. The most delicious food was salmon soup. In Finnish, it is 'Lohikeitto'. In Finland in Northern Europe, there were many

salmon-related dishes. but the soup was not salty, so it was delicious wherever I bought it. It tastes like soup with salmon oil and cream, and it was soft, moderately creamy, and flavorful. It was fun to learn **Finnish** while

ordering food. I wanted to try the food that Finnish people like and eat a lot. I tried cinnamon roll 'Korvapuustit', reindeer meat 'Poronkäristys', cheese dessert with cloudberries, 'Leipäjuusto', nut tart with raspberry jam 'Runeberg torte', a donut with cream and raspberry cream, and meatballs with the sauce that has cream 'Lihapyorykoita'. It was exciting and fun to learn Finnish, a new language while belonging to Finland. I wanted to speak Finnish better, but I could not speak either English or Finnish properly due to my lack of English skills. I realized why I should learn

English, and how important language is, and I regretted not studying hard.

Finland was an environmental country. The hotel limited the water pressure of the shower in consideration of the environment, and the room cleaning service was carried

out only on request. The most interesting thing was that there were towels in the restroom that we could wipe off our hands. is mainly equipped with Korea disposable tissues, but Finland's restrooms had strong towels that be turned around reused. It was fun to find such an environmentally friendly culture in a country that blends with the natural environment, and I thought it would be nice if environmental issues were considered important in Korea.

I traveled a total of 20 hours to Aalto University in Helsinki, Finland. It took 150 minutes from Gimpo Airport to Tokyo Haneda Airport, stay for five hours from Tokyo Haneda Airport, and took 13 hours from Tokyo Haneda Airport to Helsinki Vantaa Airport. I met supporters of the UGP program and students participating in the program at Vantaa Airport. I took a taxi to go to Heymo1 Hotel, where I would stay during the two-week UGP program. Checking in at the hotel was a problem. Because I arrived at the hotel at 5 a.m. There was a security staff, not a hotel staff. The employee didn't speak English. So I used a translator to communicate in Finnish. After many twists and turns, I finished checking in the hotel. After a short rest, I heard that a Korean teacher had arrived at the hotel lobby. Also, the hotel staff came to work. After that, all students finished checking in the hotel completely. I went out with UGP students to look around the hotel, but it was raining and windy. Despite the use of an umbrella, it was good for nothing. The wind blew so dynamically that the umbrella flipped over and broke. The sea was frozen solid. It was the first day I experienced the bitter cold of Finland.

I came into the hotel for a while and warmed up. I went to a restaurant near the hotel to have lunch. I ordered and ate Minced meat sauce (11 euros) at a Katriina restaurant. I experienced Finnish food for the first time. The first impression was very "salty". Generally, Finnish food had a strong seasoning. I means, the seasoning of the dish is too strong. And because Finland's staple food was "potatoes," more than half of the food was full of potatoes. The owner of the restaurant in Katriina didn't know how to speak English. However, I communicated completely using a translator because I had already experienced it. I went to Alepa, which is 5 minutes away from the hotel for dinner. Alepa is a supermarket in Finland. I think Alepa is the representative mart in Finland. I bought a bagel and a large bottle of carbonated water. I bought it because I thought it was water, but it was carbonated water. Who knew to sell sparkling water in a 1.5 litre PET bottle? UGP students and Korean teachers also bought carbonated water because they thought it was water. I searched on the Internet and found that Mineral is written on carbonated water. Also, water is Vesi in Finnish. Another tip is that sparkling water has Mineralvatten on the plastic bottle label and just water has Kallvatten on the plastic bottle label. The hotel breakfast was not bad enough. Every morning, I could choose one drink, one hamburger, one fruit, and one yogurt. There were oranges and

apples for drinks. The hamburgers were prepared in a separate vegan way. The fruits were oranges, tangerines, bananas, and apples. Yogurt had blueberries, peaches, and plain. There was something unusual about the Heymo1 hotel. You have to pay 15 euros in advance to open the refrigerator except for the breakfast refrigerator. It is a system in which when you take out an item in the refrigerator, you pay back to your account after excluding the price of the item from 15 euros. It was very uncomfortable. It's been almost 20 days since I used the refrigerator, but I still haven't gotten a refund. I paid 30 euros in advance because I used the refrigerator twice that day. I actually used item is about 10 euros. I finished the night without a problem. Monday, January 16, was the first day to head to Aalto University. Everyone gathered in the hotel lobby at 8:30 a.m. I couldn't sleep well because I wasn't fully adjusted to the time difference. Nevertheless, everyone safely finished their attendance check. We headed to a subway station called Keilaniemi, 5 minutes away from the hotel. I headed to Aalto-vliopisto, one stop away. This is Aalto University. It was a strange school, but I saw many internal structures on the Internet, so I was friendly and glad. I headed to a classroom called T003. There was a foreign teacher, Kuikka Saara. She did presentation which is "Welcome to Finland and Aalto University (Digital Business, Advanced Technologies and Innovation)". On the first day, there was an overall introduction to the program. And there was an overall self-introduction of UGP students I saw for the first time. Everyone was embarrassed, but they successfully finished introducing themselves. To relieve the hard atmosphere, I solved the episode of rain and wind the day before. Everyone laughed. It seemed to help the class atmosphere even a little bit. In the morning, I went on a campus tour with a guide. The guide's explanation was excellent, but it seemed to proceed a little faster because there was not enough time to introduce the entire school. It was a shame that Aalto University only introduced buildings that looked like the main building, even though there were many buildings like UNIST. However, the size of one building was great enough to run out of time even though it was explained for an hour. There were a lot of work spaces at Aalto University where many good works could be produced. And there were many places for students to sit and relax. There were also many places to sit and discuss. When we were given a short break, we took great pictures of each other. Personally, I like my picture taken on the first day. This is a picture of me doing a "V" while sitting on the stairs where anyone can see the Aalto University logo.

On the first day, I went to the student cafeteria for lunch. I got a student discount, so I got a discount of about 3 euros for a meal equivalent to 8 euros which is corresponding to non-discount price. Finnish food doesn't suit me. I ate lunch to live. After lunch, I stopped by the Aalto University Shop. There were T-shirts, hats, postcards,

water bottles, and personal items made by Aalto students. Regardless of your willingness to buy, it is also good to stop by and take a look. In addition, I was able to get a discount on Aalto University students, so I was able to buy it at a lower price than the actual price. In the afternoon class, Laura Kitinoja gave a presentation called Introduction to Team Projects. It was the first start for a two-week Team Project. On this day, our team took on the theme of Sustainable Consumption and Production, which corresponds to Sustainable Development Goals 12 (SDG12). Our team's name was Salmiakki. Salmiakki is a Finnish "national food". It tastes salty and bitter at the same time. Salmiakki, the main ingredient of western licorice, has a completely different taste from oriental licorice and has a unique taste with salt and ammonium chloride. There was no UGP team member who liked this Salmiakki. However, Saara teacher said she liked it very much. In fact, I could see Salmiakki in candy, jelly, gum, ice cream, and chocolate at the mart. In the afternoon, I had sufficient discussion with my team members about the project to be carried out. By 16 o'clock we had finished our class. And on the first day, we headed to Kamppi station to have dinner together. After passing the European-inspired street, we arrived at Kulta Kitchen & Bar. The mood of this restaurant was very good. It was subtle and the best comfort I could feel in Europe. As soon as I arrived, I ate rye bread and champagne. Soon after, I ate salmon soup, reindeer meat, mashed potatoes, and red wine. Finally, I ate cheese bread with cinnamon and fresh fruit. Before going back to the hotel, I took a tram and felt the night view of Europe. The first day ended safely with a great photo taken at the National Theater of Suomen Kansasallisteateri. On the second day, I could learn Finnish. Kiitos means thank you. For lunch, I ate sushi and fruit at Konichiwa in Aalto University. In the afternoon class, I was able to develop the team project further. Thanks to the instructor's excellent diction and delivery, the class was not boring, but lively and energetic. After finishing the afternoon class that day, I once again wandered the streets of Helsinki at night. However, there were many twists and turns because of the snow and wind. In particular, I visited Helsinki Cathedral called Helsinki Tuomikirkko. It is a representative landmark of Helsinki. The panoramic view of Helsinki Senate Square in front of this place was art. I took good pictures with my UGP friends and even took a group picture. I had dinner at Helsinki Briggeri Brewhouse. Twelve people had dinner together. 


Figure 4 Finland Traditional Market, Aurora, and Nuuksio
